

ROTARY CLUB OF CANTON ANNUAL AWARDS

The Robert S. Stubbs II "Guardian of Ethics" Award

This award recognizes an individual who has made outstanding contributions that foster the development of ethics. The award singles out a person who has made contributions in business, media, academia or government and who has by his or her actions, writing, policies and public pronouncements strengthened and fostered development of ethical practices.

Coxe Award (Rotarian of the Year)

The Coxe, Rotarian of the Year Award, was established in 1972 and is given in memory of outstanding Canton Rotary Club member, Carlisle N. Cox. Colonel Cox joined the Rotary Club of Canton in 1951 and remained an active member until his death in 1968. The Coxe Award is given annually to the member of the Rotary Club of Canton who most exemplifies the spirit and leadership demonstrated by Colonel Carlisle Cox and constitutes the Rotarian of the Year.

Rotary International Avenues of Service

Recognizing that the strength of the Rotary movement is founded on the service carried out by club members worldwide, this citation program provides a means for Rotary clubs to personally recognize one member of the club for his/her outstanding efforts in the Avenues of Service.

Lamar Haley Award (Community Service)

The award was named for Lamar Haley, an outstanding Rotarian(s) and community leader(s), who had recently died after a tragic automobile accident. The award will be given annually in memory of his legacy of exemplary community service. The Lamar Haley Community Service Award recognizes citizens who have exemplary volunteer service. Recipients may be non-Rotarians or Rotarians.

W. Lee Arrendale Award (Vocational Excellence)

Rotary International District 6910 and the Rotary Club of Habersham County established the W. Lee Arrendale Rotary International District 6910 Award for Vocational Excellence during Rotary year 1990-91 as part of the District's ongoing efforts in its Vocational Service program.

Jean Harris Award (Service above Self)

This distinguished award honors the efforts of non-Rotarian women who have made a significant contribution to the development and progress of others in their communities. Rotary Club of Canton annually recognizes a non-Rotarian woman whose volunteer efforts in the areas of Health, Education, Economic and Personal Development have made a significant impact on the lives of women and children.

Bob Robinson GRSP Leadership Award

This distinguished award was named for Bob Robinson, an outstanding Rotarian and supporter of the Georgia Rotary Student Program (GRSP), who died following a heroic battle with cancer. The award will be given in memory of his legacy of exemplary service to Rotary and GRSP.

Colonial George Bailey Distinguished Leadership Award

The distinguished award was named for Canton Rotarian, Colonial George Bailey. The award recognizes an individual who has or currently serves in our armed forces for their superior leadership and actions that have elevated the military service and public service profession through "Service Above Self", and who has exhibited the consistent dedication and commitment to the ideas of Rotary and commitment to public service by demonstrating a devotion to help raise public service to greater heights. The award will be given to one or more individuals during the annual Public Safety Appreciation Luncheon.
